12 WAYS TO SAVE ON YOUR ENERGY BILLS THIS WINTER.

- Caulk and weatherstrip drafty doors and windows, and use a door sweep to reduce air leakage and drafts.
- **Install storm windows** over single pane windows or use plastic film window kits. If your windows are more than 20 years old, consider upgrading with energy efficient double pane windows.
- **Caulk and seal gaps** where plumbing, ducting, or electrical wiring penetrates through exterior walls, floors, and ceilings.
- Install a programmable thermostat and set it to automatically lowering the temperature at night when you're sleeping or when no one is at home.
- Open your curtains, blinds and shades on sunny winter days, and close them at night.
- Close your closet doors and your fireplace damper and make sure the opening is sealed when your fireplace is not being used.
- Make sure heating registers are not
 blocked or closed (closed registers add
 pressure to ducts and can make them leak).
- Upgrade attic insulation to R-49 or greater (higher R values mean greater insulation levels and thus more energy savings).
- Reduce the temperature setting of your water heater to 120 degrees
- Have your furnace checked annually by a trained professional to ensure your heating system is working at peak performance and efficiency.
- **Replace furnace filters every month** during the heating season.
- Replace an aging furnace with an efficient model. We offer rebates on energy-efficient furnaces, too! Visit www. SummitNaturalGasMaine.com for details.

Maine Housing

The Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP)

helps qualified homeowners and renters pay for heating costs. You can also qualify for energy-related repairs if you are eligible for HEAP.

Eleven Community Action Agencies (CAA) distribute the funds throughout Maine, in most cases directly to the fuel vendors. The program is not intended to pay for all heating costs, but to assist in paying the heating bills. The amount of help you may receive from HEAP is based on your household size, income, and energy costs. Contact your local CAA to find out if you qualify today!

The Weatherization Program provides grants to low-income homeowners and renters to reduce energy costs by improving home energy efficiency.

Weatherization improvements may include insulation, weather-stripping, caulking, and some safety-related repairs. Central Heating Improvement Program (CHIP) grants may be used to repair or replace central heating systems.

Central Heating Improvement Program (CHIP)

provides heating system repair and replacement services to low-income households. Priority is given to households that have no heat.
